

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

OF ALARM



You should always report any physical change or irregularity. Don't underestimate the physical symptoms of your body.



KEEP IN MIND THAT:

Some symptoms may be expected side effects of the treatment and are transient and minors. However, there are others that point to serious potential problems.

HEAD OVER TO EMERGENCY IF:

- * Intense and persistent pain.
- * Blurry vision.
- * Loss of consciousness or memory.
- * Changes in behavior.
- * Severe constipation.
- * No production or pain when urinating.
- * Bleeding.
- * Sensation of suffocation or suffocation, breathing with effort or whistling.
- * Fever greater than or equal to 38 ° C or intense chills.
- * Blisters, rashes or ulcers on the skin.
- * Swelling, redness, heat and / or pain in the canalization site or catheter.
- * Diarrhea or prolonged vomiting.
